


UNDERGROUND BLISS

KAYAKAPI PREMIUM CAVES

A s being one of the first settlement zones in Cappadocia's centrally located City of Ürgüp, the historical site of Kayakapı Neighbourhood – which is also known as the Landowners' Neighborhood is returning back to its glory days under the name of Kayakapı Premium Caves – Cappadocia, supported by UNESCO and World Heritage Center is formed by hundreds of cave houses and historical structures. The Cave Hotel is located in a historical neighbourhood with a 10th century cave Church, a historical Mosque dating back to the Seljuq Empire and the house of St. John the Russian with it's unique Ürgüp/Cappadocia view. The cave rooms, suites and the mansions with sizes varying from 33 sqm and 253 sqm, are designed for daily needs and luxury - the holidays come with various facilities like central floor heating system, bathroom with bath tub or Jacuzzi or shower, free wireless connection, heated private indoor swimming pool, outdoor pool, Turkish bath, sauna, fireplace, private chalet and a private view point terrace.

MUSEUM HOTEL

Built in restored caves and stone houses that are thousands of years old, Museum Hotel has transformed these hand-sculpted structures into a world-renowned luxury property. Located in Uçhisar at the pinnacle of Cappadocia, a UNESCO world heritage site, Museum Hotel offers unmatched panoramic views of spectacular sunrise balloon launches and stunning sunsets. Meticulously restored and adorned with antiquities registered at the Museum of Nevsehir, the hotel's 30 rooms and suites are each an exotic retreat. The original structures have been preserved, including their unique elements — from dovecotes to stone columns to secret tunnels — all worked into the exquisite designs. Roomy and spacious, each is adorned with individually-chosen furniture, textiles and artwork. All rooms feature amazing views and modern amenities, with special individual touches to be found, from wine on tap to warmed marble massage stones, fish ponds, and private wine cellars.

HOTEL PERIVOLAS

Set within an amphitheatrical landscape of curves stepping down to a black stone terrace, Hotel Perivolas stands out from Oia's whitewashed cliffside. Once the homes, wineries and stables of Santorini's fishermen and farmers, this group of 300 year old caves has been transformed into a complex of serene private houses, with a spectacular pool flowing over the edge of the cliff into an Aegean horizon. Suites with white walls and a few bursts of bright colour, have the most private locations within the hotel. They're open-plan with a combined sitting room and bedroom with a queen-sized bed. Overlooking the Caldera, they offer simple elegance with the charming touch of antique furnishings, and a breathtaking view of the Aegean. They offer various types of accomodation according to one's needs and budget. Right from studios, junior suites to more luxurious superior suites, delux suites, new perivolas suite, which features a pool with hydrotherapy jets, and the perivolas suite. They also provide boat tours to explore the magnificient seascape of Santorini.

SEXTANTIO LE GROTTE DELLA CIVITA

Sextantio Le Grotte della Civita in the Sassi di Matera - UNESCO World Heritage Site in the Basilicata region - is the most extreme expression of a historical Minor Heritage. A heritage, which represents the almost paradigmatic expression of this Minor History, marked by rocky caves, inhabited until the first years of the fifties. The sassi (stone settlement) have been turned into 18 romantic boutique bedrooms, simply furnished, candlelit and calming. Sextantio Le Grotte della Civita is a cultural project born to bring hospitality experience outside the schematics, not classifiable as stars and far from any traditional concept of luxury, so much so that the New York Times deemed it one of the 'most extraordinary destinations in the world', the Times 'one of the ten most beautiful hotels on the

international scene' and the Tatler guide of Condé Nast has included among 'the one hundred most beautiful hotels on the planet.'
